Frida had a difficult childhood, surviving first polio at 6 and then a serious bus accident at 18 During her lengthy convalescence she discovered her love for painting At 22, Frida married the famous Mexican muralist Diego Rivera Their stormy relationship survived many challenges including infidelity, divorce, remarriage and health issues
