Wife's tale, like her prologue, centralizes the problem of resistance In the tale, resistance is primarily expressed in the knight's rather impressive and prolonged desire to remain ignorant of the meaning of his quest Rather than undergoing what some see as a "final transformation"⁴ or "steady rehabilitation"⁵ over the course of the tale
